TOPICS:

Mr. Bitgood conducted an inspection on Douglass St. drainage issue. He stated the area is level and there is nowhere for the water to go. He is suggesting a grass swale the length of the road. Parking will not be allowed and all driveways will need to have a pipe culvert under them to allow the water to drain in the swale. Mr. Bitgood estimates this could cost between \$5,000 to \$10,000. Committee is going to consider the drainage issues in the township and discuss further at the July 21st committee meeting. Mr. Considine commented the committee should consider the problems that affect the township as a whole.

Pine St. has a standing water problem caused by the tractor trailer that has been driving on the roads and breaking down the asphalt. Mr. Rambo will talk to Chief DeFalco again about enforcing the 4 ton weight limit. The Chief will also be asked to attend the July meeting to see why citations are not being issued.

Silver Lake Estates – Where does the process with the new developer stand? Mr. Poisker stated the HOA has talked to both Steve Patron and Papparone since there is nothing happening. The HOA has an agreement with Montebello Investors, LLC, Stephen Patron. The HOA has reached out to the DCA and there has not be a modification to the plan.

Mr. Alice will contact the attorney for Montebello, Mr. Washburn to see if he can find out where the development stands.

Mr. Poisker stated there is a feeling of mistrust on the part of the HOA.

Improvements to the Aura Road and Whig Lane (Monument corner), what can be done to improve the corner. Mr. Poisker recalled the reason for the closing of the cut through to all vehicles except for emergency vehicles came on a recommendation of the Chief of Police. He would like to see if the township can work with the county to improve the corner.

A resident on Maple Ave. is not happy with having a parking lot outside of their door. It was mentioned to possibly move the monument to the park where it can be viewed. The monument is on township property, but the cut through is on both township and church land. Several residents would like to see the monument moved off of the corner to a safer location. Mrs. Sammons stated her husband is a Veteran and would like to see it moved to a safer location.

Mr. Poisker stated if 100 residents were polled to see if they know what is on the monument, maybe one or 2 would know what is on it. If it is moved to the park, it could get better exposure, have events, such as Memorial Day or Veteran's Day.

Mr. Considine stated if the monument is in the park, it could be expanded to recognize soldiers from all conflicts.

Mr. Alexander, public works employee, stated he mows the corner and it is the most dangerous corner he works on. He is a Veteran and is all for having the monument moved to the park.

Mr. Bitgood said the county has jurisdiction on what happens on both roads.

Mr. Alice will talk to the engineer to see if it is plausible for the county to assist with the moving of the monument to the park and making the corner safe again.

PUBLIC PORTION:

Motion by Mr. Poisker to open the meeting to the public, seconded by Mr. Rambo, all were in favor, motion carried.

Deputy Mayor Yenner asked if anyone had any concerns they would like to bring to the township committees attention to come forward at this time.

Michael Canuso, Aura Development Group, LLC, gave an overview on the development. In order to sell a lot the plats need to be filed. There has been a change in engineer. Mr. Bitgood determined based on the township ordinance, a developers agreement was required. They have been working on that since December and committee just approved it this evening. There has been problems with the water and sewer, weather among other issues. They are now moving forward at a steady pace.

Mr. Canuso is here tonight to ask for committee approval to work in sections of project that are not yet bonded. They are currently bonded for sections 1, 2 and 3. NJ American Water is putting in the water lines and part of their policy is they loop the lines and they also require curbing to be installed before the line are run. The water pipes extend into sections 4 and 5.

Mr. Poisker asked from an engineering stand point is there any reason why the township would not allow the loop of the water and installation of curbing.

Mr. Bitgood stated that the water loop is a good thing, but the curbing is not a good thing for construction. He does not have a problem with either the looping or installation of curbing.

Mr. Canuso need committee's approval to install the water and curbing. Their goal is have the area paved by the end of the month, landscape the homes and open the models in July.

Mr. Rambo asked about the basins. Mr. Bitgood stated the basins are working.

Mr. Rambo does not have a problem approving the request.

Mr. Poisker is also in favor since the engineer is okay with this and that the exposure to the township is minimal.

Motion by Mr. Rambo, seconded by Mr. Poisker, to permit NJAW to create the water line loop and the developer to install the curbing in Aura I, sections 4 & 5, that is outside of the bonded areas. Upon roll call motion carried.

This motion will be memorialized with Resolution R-74-2015 at the next meeting.

Debbie Rosenberry, New Bridge Rd., Salem, objects to the registration fee for abandoned and vacant properties. She owns 1428 Ellis Mill Rd., Block 24 Lot 11. Her property is vacant, there is activity at the property, the taxes are paid and there is no police activity.

Deputy Mayor stated this ordinance was adopted to protect the township, it's residents and alert the police and fire of the vacant property.

Mr. Alice stated an abandoned house is a dwelling that is not currently used or occupied.

Ms. Rosenberry does not understand why she is being charged this fee. She understands this is an ordinance and probably will not change the law. She is here to express her opposition to the ordinance.

Ms. Yenner asked if the property only has to meet one of the criteria to be considered abandoned or vacant.

Letters have been sent out 2 times to the known vacant properties. Mrs. Sammons stated a lien should be placed on the properties if they have not paid the fee.

Mr. Poisker suggested sending out an initial letter stating the infraction and giving them 30 days to correct the issue and then send them the abandoned and vacant ordinance and registration requirement.

Mr. Bitgood stated the township does not know what is being stored in the house on Ellis Mill Rd., it could be hazardous and the fire department will not know what they are walking into if there is a fire.

The registration is to notify emergency personnel that the house is vacant.



Mr. Considine stated if there is a problem with public works cleaning the property, a landscaper can be contacted to clean the property. Committee approved the cleaning of the properties on the list from the zoning officer.

Committee discussed the request by Mr. Shoultz to purchase Block 115 Lot 3. The property is assessed at \$9200. The sale price would start at the price assessed by the Tax Assessor. The property by itself is not a buildable lot.

**CALENDAR YEAR 2015
ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS
AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)**

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 1.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year’s final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Elk in the County of Gloucester finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2015 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year’s final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 2% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$68,053.20 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Elk, in the County of Gloucester, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2015 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Elk shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$68,053.20 and that the CY 2015 municipal budget for the Township of Elk be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,



§63A-7. Entitled “Birth, death, marriage and domestic partnership certificates” shall be amended as follows:

§63A-7. Birth, death, marriage, civil union and domestic partnership certificates.

A. Certified copy: \$5 \$10 per copy.

Section 2.

Section 3.







B.(1) Any professional position or service contract not subject to bidding that shall expire as of December 31 of that calendar year shall be advertised by the Mayor's office, appointing authority or Board, as the case may be, in the official newspaper of the Township of Elk for publication of notices, and published on the Township's website, not later than ~~December~~ **November** 10. The published notice shall set forth the name of the position or contract which is to become open, and set forth the criteria to be considered and materials required to be submitted by the applicant.

B.(4) **(h) A current fee schedule.**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 54 ENTITLED “CONSTRUCTION CODES, UNIFORM”
OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ELK

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Elk have determined that certain amendments to Chapter 54 entitled “**Construction Codes, Uniform**” are necessary; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Elk, in the County of Gloucester and State of New Jersey, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same as follows:

Section 1.

Chapter 54 entitled “**Construction Codes, Uniform**” shall be amended to read as follows:

§ 54-2B. Building Subcode Fees.

- (d) Fees for Modular homes shall be a flat fee of \$600.00. This includes footings and foundations for placement of the structure. Any other construction that is not part of the modular home, i.e. garage, deck or added room shall be charged at the rate for ~~new construction~~ **alterations**.
- (e) Fees for Manufactured homes shall be a flat fee of \$300.00. This includes footings and foundations for placement of the structure. Any other construction that is not part of the modular **manufactured** home, i.e. garage, deck or added room shall be charged at the rate for ~~new construction~~ **alterations**.

§ 54-2F. Fees for Certificates and Other Permits are as Follows:

- (6) The fee for the first issuance and renewal of a temporary certificate of occupancy shall be \$39.00 **\$30.00** and an additional fee of \$39.00 **\$30.00** for each extension.

Section 2.

Repealer.

All prior Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 3.

Severability.

Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4.

When effective.





NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Elk, County of Gloucester that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & b, and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges.
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures.
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year.
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes.
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items.
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.

2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A:4-45.3 et. seq. are fully met. (Complies with "CAP" law.)

3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate, and correctly stated.
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth.
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised, and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.


