TOPICS:

There has been an issue with parking and the need for parking permits on some township streets. Lt. Gonnelli has researched this and the county has a program that the township can sign up for free of charge. This a live feed program and would be useful for the police department on several levels. There are several portals that would benefit the township, and we can utilize 5 of the portals as part of the free service. A few examples are if there is a resident with a disability, the information can be provided to the police department so they are aware if there is ever an emergency and all information will be kept confidential, if there is a weather emergency the residents can be notified to keep the roadways clear of vehicles, there is a vacation watch portal that could be beneficial to the residents. Lt. Gonnelli also provided committee with parking ordinances from a couple neighboring towns.

Committee is in favor of the program and asked the police for guidance with determining which streets need to have a parking permit issuance instituted.

The police department will compile a list of roads to get to Mr. Duffield, to amend our current ordinance.

Mr. Considine stated statutorily the township needs to introduce the 2019 Municipal Budget at the next meeting on March 19th. The budget at this time is under both caps the levy cap and appropriations cap. There has not been a tax increase over the last 3 years. This budget has a 2.5 cent increase. It will be an approximate \$40 increase on the average home. The budget includes a per diem mechanic for public works and the purchase of a used dump truck. The budget for the police needs a little fine tuning prior to introduction. Mr. Considine stated If committee has any questions they are more than welcome to meet with him. The budget cannot be adopted until the State certifies their aid, the County has to give their figures and the schools need to submit their figures.

GLOUCESTER COUNTY REPRESENTATIVE, Leona Mather was present to assist with any issues for the county. Ms. Mather reminded everyone that March is Tire Amnesty month in Gloucester County.
