The Regular Meeting of the Elk Township Committee was held on the above date in the Municipal Building and via Teleconference. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sammons at 7:00PM.

The Open Public Meeting Notice was read. The Salute to the Flag and the Lord's Prayer were recited in unison.

Present were: Mrs. Cowan, Mrs. Nicholson, Mr. Rambo, Mayor Sammons, Mr. Considine, CFO, and Mrs. Pine, Township Clerk, Mr. Duffield, Solicitor, Mr. Bitgood, Engineer and Chief Gonnelli. Mr. Hollywood was absent.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES of January 18, 2022 Work Session and Closed Session

Motion by Mr. Rambo, seconded by Mrs. Cowan to approve the minutes of the January 18, 2022, Work Session and Closed Session, motion carried with Mrs. Nicholson abstaining.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mrs. Nicholson reported the Environmental Commission will be updating the Elephant Swamp Park Trail Guide. They are also putting together the application for Arbor Day tree seedlings.

Mayor Sammons asked about the Salem Oak seedling that each municipality was supposed to receive. Mrs. Nicholson will check to see the status.

Mayor Sammons has received the County movie selection for Movie Night. Committee will put in for a Friday night in early June for the County to show the movie in Elk Township.

POLICE CHIEF REPORT

Chief Gonnelli, read his report for December 2021. The department received 1446 calls for service, made 12 arrests and issued 84 motor vehicle summons, responded to 18 motor vehicle crashes with 3 injuries and received 12 new fire arms applications.

The totals for the year 2021, the department received 17,080 calls for service, made 127 arrests, issued 2010 motor vehicle summons and responded to 158 motor vehicle crashes with 1 fatality.

In January 2022, the department received 1914 calls for service, made 14 arrests, issued 175 motor vehicle summons, responded to 18 motor vehicle crashes with 4 injuries. There were 14 new firearm applications. Planning has begun for Law Enforcement Appreciation Day to be held on May 20, 2022.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Mr. Rambo read the fire company reports: For the month of January 2022, Aura Fire Company responded to 12 calls, they held mandatory training and held an ice rescue drill at Lake Garrison.

Lawn's Fire Company held 4 drills, they are waiting on their 990 Form.

Ferrell Fire Company responded to 14 calls in January.

The Mayor would like to set up some meetings with the Fire Chiefs to discuss updating the Fire Company Ordinance.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Bitgood stated he is working with the contractor to finalize Jacob Harris Road and Ewan Road Phase 1 projects. Survey work is ongoing on Moods Road. The TCDI DVRPC study with Rowan University data has been received and needs to be reviewed. When the review is complete and recommendations are made, a copy will be provided to committee.

Mrs. Nicolson asked if there was any erosion issues at Dollar General. Mr. Bitgood stated they have not been working a lot due to the weather. At this time the basin is closed off and stabilized.

Mr. Duffield stated if a decibel level is listed in the ordinance, there is a process. The decibel meter will need to be certified and calibrated. Noise distrurbance is a difficult thing to prove in court.

Bob Clark, Zoning Officer, stated a decibel meter can be purchased on Amazon.

Lou Schomber, 457 Ewan Rd., stated after 13 years the drainage issue on Ewan Road is finally resolved, thanks to Mr. Rambo.
